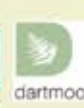

Woodland Springs is 18 miles west of the cathedral city of Exeter and 8 miles east of Okehampton. This excellent central location, along with very easy access from the A30, makes an ideal base for touring Dartmoor, Devon and the South West.

Within a few miles there is Castle Drogo, Spinster's Rock, Stone Lane Gardens incorporating the Mythic Gardens, Finch Foundry and Fingle Bridge.

You can visit Dartmoor where you can walk, ride, have a picnic or just visit many of the lovely areas such as Fernworthy reservoir, Widdicombe-on-the Moor, Haytor, Princetown and many others.

There are many good **pubs** and **restaurants** in the area as well as **golf, fishing, swimming, horse riding** and other **outdoor pursuits**.

The selection of **walks** is endless. Chagford, Okehampton & Exeter offer a wide range of different **shopping** and **sightseeing** opportunities. Days out on the sandy beaches of Devon or at the Eden Project are examples of other things you can do.

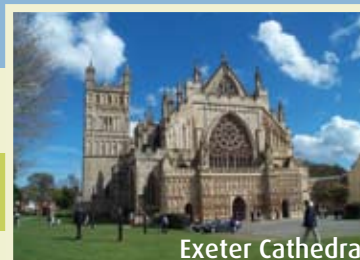

From the **M5** take **exit 31** (the end of the M5) and follow the sign posts for the **A30 Okehampton**.

Follow the **A30** for approximately 18 miles until you reach the **Whiddon Down junction** (also sign posted Services).

Follow signs for the **A382 Moretonhampstead**. Stay on the **A382** turn left at the roundabout just outside **Whiddon Down**. In about 1 mile turn left just before the sign for Venton.

Turn left again (2nd drive) into **Woodland Springs** which is approximately **150 yards** along the drive.

**Do not follow the signs for Drewsteignton from the A30.**

The brown tourist caravan signs lead the way to Woodland Springs on the A382
